


Lesson 1: Salvation

Colossians 1:15-16



Genesis 1:2

Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.



God's Perfect Creation Was Ruined

In Genesis 2, compare what God told Adam and Eve about the tree of the knowledge of good and evil with what the serpent told them about the tree in the following verses.

Genesis 2:15-17

The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. And the LORD God commanded the man, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die."

Genesis 3:15

Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden'?"

The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden, but God did say, 'You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die.'"

"You will not surely die," the serpent said to the woman. "For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God knowing good and evil."




What is Sin?

God told Adam and Eve if they ate from the tree of knowledge of good and evil, they would die. And they chose to disobey. That choice resulted in a **loss of fellowship with God** for all mankind. Later, He gave a list of laws He wanted people to obey. Underline and number the Ten Commandments in the passage below:



Exodus 20:1-17

And God spoke all these words: "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not hold anyone guiltless who misuses His name. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, ... For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but He rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the LORD your God is giving you! You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal; You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor's house... or anything that belongs to your neighbor."
